

Message from Michelle – student at ECS

Hi! I am Michelle Balgos, a student of St George and Sutherland Shire Community College (SGSSCC) doing a work placement in Engadine Community Services. I am helping in playgroups on Mondays, which is for grandparents, and Tuesdays for mums, both at 9.30 to 11.30 am. Playgroup is one of the early intervention services of ECS that works on supporting parenting and children.

There are multiple benefits of the ECS Child and Family Services through playgroups and Sutherland Shire Toy Library. I will tell you my own observation of these two and give details on how to be part of these amazing services that can help you in rearing children.

Playgroups at ECS provide a playground that is an effective way to broaden children's learning experiences by giving them an opportunity to socialise through play, which eventually leads to the development of not only emotional abilities but also motor skills. It is also a fun and relaxing chance for grand/parents to meet and talk about ideas of raising children.

I believe that playgroup is one of the most practical method for allowing children to play that enhances language, imagination, and creativity. I can see the children having fun to test out new toys and smiling from ear-to-ear when they get to try out different toys.

ECS playgroups serve as a great environment not only for the children, but also for the adults to form relationships and social groups with people sharing the same experiences. There is a \$2 fee per attendance.

Based on my experience, playgroups at ECS have the added bonus of being a good place for children to try out toys from Sutherland Shire Toy Library. There is a big indoor play space and shaded outdoor area, which secures the safety of the children.

I am full of gratitude to be part of the team of volunteers, which is led by Sandra Munn, in assisting the in and out of toys in Sutherland Shire Toy Library. The toy library has been running for more than thirtyfive years, so to be part of it is such a proud moment for me, knowing it has been the source of fun and creativity for many children. This can never be a success without the help of the people behind it and thanks to the dedication and perseverance of the volunteers.

Moreover, Sutherland Shire Toy Library provides an affordable way to borrow good quality, safe items that vary from small indoor up to big outdoor toys. It has more than 500 toys that can cater to every stages of development: baby toys, musical instruments, construction sets, puzzles, ride on and game sets.

Local families pay an annual fee to be a member and borrow up to 3 toys, 3 puzzles and 3 games every 3 weeks. Through the click and collect system online, family can log into the database, view the catalogue and book toys prior to collection. The technology has allowed us to easily make bookings making it more convenient and accessible. The Toy Library is open for pick up in the afternoon of every Monday and Thursday between 1-4pm and the 2nd and 4th Saturday mornings each month.

I can see clearly that these two services are really making a difference in the lives of people as a part of the effective intervention in supporting parenting and children.
